

## **Dunbar, LTMS take Governor's Cup honors**

Paul Laurence Dunbar High School placed first at the regional level of the Governor's Cup competition, with Henry Clay and Lafayette high schools taking second and third place, respectively.

In the middle school division, Lexington Traditional Magnet School won first place, followed by Winburn.

The Dunbar, Henry Clay, LTMS and Winburn quick-recall teams and the Lafayette future problem-solving team, along with the top five students in each contest area, will advance to the state finals, set for March 15-17 in Louisville.

The Governor's Cup includes six individual events: written assessment exams in math, science, social studies, language arts and arts/humanities; and composition (on-demand writing), as well as team competition in quick recall ("quiz bowl") and future problem solving (creative thinking).

The Governor's Cup was founded in 1986 as a way to promote, reward and recognize outstanding academic achievement. Now it is the state's premier academic event.

In the elementary division (grade 5 and below), students take part in a district and regional competition. The middle grades (6-8) and high school (9-12) divisions include a district, regional and state competition.
