

UK honors Teachers Who Made a Difference

Celebrating its 10th year, the UK College of Education's Teachers Who Made a Difference program honored a record number of educators in 2008.

More than 130 people from 16 states were recognized March 29 for the significant influence they have had in the lives of their students. They were invited to a breakfast reception at the UK Student Center, where students from Maxwell Elementary School performed a couple of songs in Spanish.

Teachers, principals, professors and other educational professionals can be honored. In its 10 years, the program has recognized more than 1,000 educators.

Teachers Who Made a Difference never was intended as a competition, and every nominee is honored. While a limited number are accepted each year, nominations received after the deadline will be at the top of the next list.
