

Summer school is right around the corner

Fayette County Public Schools offers several summer school options. High school students can sign up for initial core-content classes in the Plato program, and they can earn credit for physical education and health courses. In addition, FCPS offers credit recovery for students who need to make up a class or those who wish to retake a course to improve their grade.

Initial credit Plato district summer school: Martin Luther King Jr. Academy, 2200 Liberty Road

- First session: June 15-26, 8 a.m. to noon
- Second session: July 6-24, 8 a.m. to noon

Costs (initial credit Plato program): Fayette County students: \$160 per session; non-Fayette County students: \$250 per session. (For Fayette County residents who qualify for reduced lunch the cost is \$100; for students who qualify for free lunch the cost is \$75.)

District initial physical education course: Henry Clay High School, 2100 Fontaine Road.

- First session: June 10-23, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.
- Second session: July 8-21, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Students may attend either session to earn a half credit in physical education. Students will have a half-hour break and must provide their own lunch.

Health credit:

This credit will be offered by correspondence or e-school. Contact your school counselor.

Credit recovery:

This will be handled by each high school. Check with the counselors for details.

Note: All courses, with the exception of physical education, will be core-content online learning.
